Application for Support to Scientific Meetings

Regulation

In its General Assembly of 18 November 2016, the Associação Portuguesa de História Económica e Social (APHES) decided to promote an annual competition with the aim of fostering the formation and the scientific debate in the fields of Economic and Social History.

1

The award aims at supporting the organization of scientific events promoted by or directed to young researchers. The kind of events to be supported can be academic conferences, training courses, rapid courses or other events relevant for the academic activity of young researchers.

2

The award has a global value that may go up to 1000 euros and will be attributed by a jury constituted by the members of the board of APHES.

§1

The jury might be expanded by co-optation of new elements.

§2

The value of the financial support will be distributed among the proposals according to their merit and paid to the institution where the candidates develop their activity.

3

To be eligible to apply, proposals must comply with the following requirements:

§1

Proposals must be submitted by doctoral researchers or Ph.D. holders having concluded their degree in the six years prior to the opening of the annual competition; or by senior researchers, provided that the event is aimed at young researchers.

§2

The proposals should include: a) the programme of the event; b) the objectives of the event; c) the theme of the event; d) the name of the participants and the titles of their respective papers; e) the place where the event will take place; f) the dates when the event will take place; g) a provisional budget for the event.

§3

Comply with any further conditions laid down in the announcement of the annual competition.

The proponents should be APHES members in good standing in the current and last year (i.e., those whose annual membership fee is paid up-to-date in the current and last year).

4

Proposals should be sent to <u>geral@aphes.pt</u> in the 60 days following the opening of the competition, together with the information referring to the requirements presented in 3§1 to 3§4.

5

Proposals may include researchers affiliated with different research and higher education institutions.

6

The jury is sovereign, deciding in full autonomy on all matters, from its internal organization to the absolute and relative quality of each proposal. Depending on the quality of the proposals evaluated, the jury may decide not to award this financial support.

7

The jury's decisions will be announced up until three weeks following the deadline for application, and they are final and irrevocable.

8

The APHES board may suspend this competition at any moment.

9

This regulation may be altered, fully or partially, by a majority of members in a General Assembly.
